Monthly Service Activity Report

Monthly Service Activity can be reported only on line at MyLCI. Activities are arranged by the month in which they were done. The report can be submitted any time from July 1 of the current lion year until July of the following year but it is generally easier to report as soon as convenient after they are performed. If the club has no activities in a given month, no report is to be submitted. (Note this differs from Monthly Membership report which is to be done every month.). There is **no** End of Year report or summary.

Prepare before your logon to MyLCI. (If you are inactive more 15 minutes after logon, you may be dropped.) Report only one activity per report.



Service Activities reporting is Important

1. For LCI

- a. Service Activities Reports are important when we (LCIF) partners with Foundations like Gates, Clinton, Carter, Pfizer, Alcon, Hilton, Johnson & Johnson, Novo, etc. We/They need to have a traceable record of service hours and dollars donated. The first question the foundations ask is, "What contributions are your clubs making world-wide?" "How many service hours are they putting in?", "How many dollars have been raised?" "Can they raise the matching grants?"
 - If we can partner with other Foundations, that means less pressure on clubs and Lions to raise the entire amount to continue the work that is being accomplished around the globe. That means that when we need grants and funds for our own programs and projects, more funding will be available. A matching grant increases your clubs contribution
- b. Service Activities are best filed soon after they are complete. There is no longer an annual report to do. Clubs can download a single document with the entire year's activities. Two previous years are available.
- c. National and international guests to our district often comment on all the wonderful things that our district is doing. Their information is usually from the Service Activities report. We could look even better if more of the Lion Club activities were reported.

2. For the District

- a. District officers have access to the Service Activity Reports as soon as they are reported.
- b. When clubs are not reporting, the question is? "Do they not know how, or are they not doing anything." If the former we can offer help: if the latter, there may be a problem which needs considerable help.
- c. It has become much easier to file the reports online than it was previously and the reporting is in real time. It is your clubs' opportunity for bragging rights. The information is also used to augment and add to our programs. It is the sharing of successful fundraisers, service projects and programs.

3. For your Club

a. Service actives reports are available for the previous two years. That gives your new club officers time to see what has been reported in the past years. You can download and save these reports as part of your club's archive.


